Inclusive Education Supports at a Glance

Students, families and teachers will see more school supports this September to ensure students have the help they need to be more successful in school. Government is investing an initial \$15 million to add more inclusive education supports provincewide.

100 Student and classroom supports in the form of Child and Youth Care Practitioners and Education Assistants.

70 Specialist teachers with expertise in supporting children with behaviour and learning challenges. These include Behaviour Support Teachers, Learning and Resource Teachers and Autism Teachers.

11 Parent Navigators to help families learn and understand what programs and services are available for their children, help them get access, and support learning at home.

8 Alternative Education Programs to engage and teach students in innovative ways that meet their unique needs. The programs will help students who require different, perhaps non-traditional, programming to help them be successful.

6 School Psychologists/Speech Language Pathologists.

4 Student Health Partnership Nurses to work with primary health providers and school staff to ensure care plans for students are implemented.

2 Achieve Programs, through the Nova Scotia Community College, to help students with complex needs better prepare for life after high school.

Les dispositifs de soutien à l'intégration dans l'éducation en quelques chiffres

Il y aura plus de dispositifs de soutien pour les élèves, les familles et les enseignants dans les écoles à la rentrée de septembre, pour veiller à ce que les élèves disposent de l'aide nécessaire pour connaître une plus grande réussite à l'école. Le gouvernement va consentir un effort budgétaire initial de 15 millions de dollars pour ajouter des dispositifs de soutien à l'intégration dans l'éducation à l'échelle de la province.

100 dispositifs de soutien pour les élèves et les salles de classe, sous la forme de spécialistes de la prise en charge de l'enfance et de la jeunesse et d'aide-enseignants

70 enseignants spécialisés dans l'appui aux enfants ayant des problèmes de comportement ou des besoins sur le plan de l'apprentissage (cette catégorie comprenant les enseignants spécialistes du soutien sur le plan du comportement, les enseignants-ressources et les enseignants spécialistes de l'autisme)

17 spécialistes du soutien parental qui aideront les familles à découvrir et à comprendre les programmes et les services qui sont à la disposition de leur enfant et à obtenir des dispositifs de soutien et de l'aide pour l'apprentissage à la maison

8 programmes éducatifs de substitution pour motiver les élèves et leur prodiguer un enseignement selon des approches innovantes répondant à leurs besoins bien particuliers (ces programmes servent à aider les élèves qui, pour diverses raisons, exigent des programmes différents et parfois non conventionnels pour pouvoir connaître la réussite)

6 psychologues scolaires / orthophonistes

4 infirmières du partenariat pour la santé des élèves, qui collaboreront avec les prestataires de services de soins de santé primaires et le personnel des écoles pour assurer la mise en œuvre des plans de prise en charge des élèves

2 programmes « Achieve » offerts par l'intermédiaire du Nova Scotia Community College pour aider les élèves ayant des besoins complexes à mieux se préparer à la vie après l'école secondaire
